Continue Creating and Protecting Strong and Sustainable Neighborhoods

- Adopted the Tweedy Boulevard Specific Plan
- Completed the 10-year Parks & Hollydale Master Plans
- Initiated Citywide Parking Study
- Secured \$4.6 million in Grant Funding for Improvements on Tweedy Mile
- Funded \$100,000 for the Energy Savings Program with So Cal Gas

Continue Infrastructure Improvements

- Initiated construction of a \$20.4M Firestone Boulevard Street Improvement Project
- Completed Design on the Garfield Avenue and Imperial Highway Street Improvements to Enhance Safety and Beautify
- Secured \$1.2 million for the Chakemco Street Improvements Project to Enhance Student and Pedestrian Safety
- Secured \$3 million in Grant Funding for the Urban Orchard Project
